The Levi Atwood House was built about 1851 and L was one of the first Greek Revival homes in Chatham. Mr. Atwood had a thriving store in a barn on the property, and he built this house for his bride. It has a stylized temple-form front with an overshot gable pediment supported by four fluted Doric

columns. The present owner found that both the foundation and the columns needed to be replaced. Triple-hung floor to ceiling windows were installed to replace double hung windows which had been part of a previous renovation. The house now has a full basement with radiant heat. The roof was redone with red cedar shingles, and copper gutters and

downspouts were installed. The result is a gracious Greek Revival home. with modern amenities.
